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5. Stories of Agriculture

In this part of the exhibition
you can see objects about farming.

Farming means working the land,
for example planting seeds to grow fruits
or vegetables we eat every day.

The most famous tool used for farming is the **plough**.
The plough turns the soil
so it can be planted with seeds.

Even today people still farm the land.

When the land is worked, its colour changes.
If you look at the window curtains now,
you will see many colours,
like the colours of the worked soil.

Have you ever planted something?

Did you know that after working the land many times,
the soil needs to rest for a while?

This means you must **stop working the land
and not plant or sow anything for some time.**

In this part of the exhibition, you can also see a **yoke**.

A yoke is a tool
that goes around the necks of animals
like oxen (cattle),
to keep them together and help them pull
vehicles or farming machines.

In this room, you can see and touch a yoke.
